<b>Alliance for Pioneer Square</b>	City Hall Park Master Planning Process To convene community stakeholders to develop a plan to enhance the public realm and public safety for all users.	\$115,000
<b>Chief Seattle Club</b>	Fortson Square Redevelopment This project offers capital improvements to improve public safety, cultural equity in design, and pedestrian usability. Design elements to incorporate Coast Salish design principles.	\$105,000
<b>Chief Seattle Club</b>	Native Works Development of retail program for Native artists, growing community advocacy and activating public spaces at Chief Seattle Club's ?al?al project.	\$ 33,289
<b>Chinese Memorial Project</b>	Memorial to the Chinese Expulsion in Seattle Seattle's early pioneers included Chinese people, who established a Chinese quarter in Pioneer Square in the early 1870s. Seattle's initial Chinatown in Pioneer Square is all but hidden, as is the exclusion of Chinese from Seattle in 1886, with the anti-Chinese riot. A permanent memorial will promote, preserve, document and strengthen the history and culture of Pioneer Square. This grant supports Phase 1 artist selection and design of the memorial.	\$ 28,000
<b>CID Coalition</b>	Activating the Chinatown-International District for Equitable Development and Community Control Through public outreach, events, workshops, and trainings, the Chinatown-International District (CID) Coalition will expand opportunities for community-centered dialogue on anti-gentrification and anti-displacement efforts, create equitable access to information on new developments in the CID, and connect with community members to advocate for more community control.	\$ 10,000
<b>CIDBIA</b>	C-ID Neighborhood Marketing Historic South Downtown funding will allow the CIDBIA to continue marketing efforts within Chinatown-ID and promote the C-ID as a destination neighborhood. The project will include continuing active promotions such as the Happy Hour Food Walk, as well as new projects such as creating promotional videos and digital marketing material.	\$ 35,000
<b>Compass Housing</b>	Capital improvements to day room The funds will assist Compass Housing to renovate and improve the day room, serving homeless clients.	\$ 60,000
<b>DESC</b>	3 <sup>rd</sup> Ave. Engagement Team Funds from Historic South Downtown will support DESC's Third Avenue Engagement Team, which patrols the sidewalk on the block during weekdays, and helps DESC clients and other individuals experiencing homelessness stay safe, receive needed services, and maintain a safe walkway for tourists, jurists and other pedestrians.	\$ 35,000
<b>Friends of Little Saigon</b>	Little Saigon Cultural Gathering Space Program Development Capacity building to support the development of FLS's Small Business Assistance program and Arts and Cultural Engagement, funding a full-time staff person to support implementation of these programs in the Little Saigon Cultural Gathering space.	\$ 35,000
<b>Historic China Gate Foundation</b>	Historic Chinatown Gate cleaning and maintenance. The Historic Chinatown Gate Foundation designed, constructed in 2007 and maintained the Greater Seattle Chinatown Gate for the past 12 years. The traditional Chinese Gate engenders Community pride, increases tourism by endowing Greater Seattle with a signature landmark in the Chinatown International District and adds vitality and cultural interest to the district. The grant will support the required maintenance of the Gate for the next ten year segment of the City Ordinance.	\$ 5,000
<b>International Community Health Services (ICHS)</b>	Permanent multimedia installation on history of ICHS The funds will help develop a permanent multi-media exhibition in the ICHS International District Medical and Dental clinic by the Fall of 2019. The exhibit will document and display the history of the agency and its vital role in providing affordable health care to South Downtown residents over the past 46 years.	\$ 80,000
<b>Interim Community Development Association</b>	Uncle Bob's Community Room InterIm CDA's upcoming low-income housing project, Uncle Bob's Place, will include a 500 square foot community gathering space, prominently located at the streetfront corner of the building. Unofficially named the B.S. Room, it will be designed to carry forward Uncle Bob's legacy of activism in the spirit of community –to foster community building and organizing towards strengthening and protecting the people and culture of the International District. Grant funds will be used for the core and shell construction of this space.	\$100,000
<b>Interim SCIDpda Partnership</b>	Neighborhood Disaster Prep Through community organizing, outreach, education, training, drills and planning, Interim CDA and SCIDpda seek to empower those who live or work in the CID to help themselves and their neighbors when disaster strikes. The project would build both individual and collective capacities to navigate and negotiate for culturally meaningful resources for ourselves and the larger CID community.	\$ 35,000
<b>International Examiner</b>	To increase our news coverage in the International Examiner of any and all issues that affect the preservation of the CID neighborhood; and to conduct historical research for and to help produce and promote a memoir written by community leader and IE board president Ron Chew, which will be released later in the year in 2019.	\$ 20,000
<b>Jazz Club Murals</b>	Restoration and preservation of historic jazz club murals uncovered during renovation of Louisa Hotel.	\$ 40,000
<b>One World Now</b>	Language and cultural education Capital improvements and program funding to support language and cultural education for youth, including world languages, leadership development workshops, community service, and one-on-one mentoring.	\$ 30,000
<b>RAVE</b>	Physical activity for youth Increase of physical and healthy social activity among CID youth and families using soccer as the vehicle.	\$ 10,000
<b>SCIDpda</b>	Lights On! Campaign An in-language outreach campaign to encourage CID business and property owners and manager to help increase the overall neighborhood night-time lighting experience during the most active evening hours. With a successful campaign, business and building owners could brighten the evening streetscape and enhance perceptions of safety.	\$ 34,250
<b>SCIDpda</b>	Business Development Workshops This funds the continuation of our business educational workshop series. The workshop series provides professional and technical support and extensive outreach necessary to reach immigrant entrepreneurs. It also includes one-on-one direct assistance to businesses with finding space, technical and financing referrals and lease negotiation, as well as advocacy with developers and landlords.	\$ 35,000
<b>Seniors in Action</b>	Security Cameras Seattle Chinatown public safety CCTV community project aims to reduce crime, increase resident safety and improve the business environment in the district.	\$ 35,000
<b>Spark the Parks</b>	Activating public parks with activities for youth Focusing on three CID public parks, improve public health by encouraging outdoor recreation and community gardening.	\$ 35,000
<b>Theater Off Jackson</b>	Capital Improvement Feasibility Study Theatre Off Jackson is embarking on an overall capital improvement project for our two-venue facility, including façade improvements (signage, a secure entry-way), water-proofing of flooring, HVAC, ADA, and other structural and aesthetic improvements to increase safety and comfort for facility users and visitors. The initial process will include a feasibility study for capital improvements and working with legal and real estate consultants to establish a long-term lease with the building owners.	\$ 34,000
